



Congratulations to all of the winners and placegetters, there was some great drafting over the weekend.











40th Anniversary of the GOA

The Gippsland Campdraft Association began forty years ago in 1973. It came about because a branch of the Australian Stock Horse Society was formed in 1972 and a question was raised as to what sort of competitions the members could hold to show their horses.

lan Gibson suggested campdrafting would do this admirably. Alan Sheridan agreed and they called a meeting on the 3rd of September 1973 at the Presbyterian Hall in Bairnsdale. Present at the meeting were Ian Gibson, Alan Sheridan, Christa Mitchell(Treasure), Alan Stewart, Ken Howlett, Ronald and David Rogers, Kevin Luxford, Owen Waller, Gerald Ventry, Barry Bourke and Ron Connley.

Owen Waller was elected as the first President, Ron Connley the vice-president, Christa Mitchell was the first secretary and Marg Anderson was the assistant secretary/treasurer. It was decided that the first campdrafting practice day would be held on Alan Sheridans leasehold near Johnsonville on the 30th of September 1973. It was also decided to affiliate with the Southern District Campdrafting Association.

Originally it was called the Eastern Campdrafting Association, until a general meeting on the 29th of November 1974 when Christa asked what we were east of? So it was then changed to the Gippsland Campdrafting Association at an AGM at the Commercial Hotel in Bairnsdale on the 19th of March 1976.

The first draft to run was at White Acres on Les Whites property in November 1973. Albert Ah Yee won the Open. The next draft was at Hinnomunjie on the 8th December 1973, where Billy Smith from Omeo Station at Coonamble won the Open. Drafting then went back to White Acres in January or February 1974.

Alistair Irving ran a draft at Woodside football oval on the 5th April 1974 where it was very wet. Christa states they had insurance which would only pay out if it rained a certain amount. The rain poured down and she recollects they received almost \$3000.

Ronald Rogers ran a draft at Buchan on 15th February 1974 and another in 1975.

Stratford held a draft in October 1974, White Acres in November 1974, Hinnomunjie in December 1974 (I remember it being quite warm in those days!), Ensay in 1974 (unsure of the month, possibly December with Hinnomunjie?)

Eventually other drafts came into being with Cabanandra, Sale and Maffra all running drafts in 1975. Swan Reach and Wonthaggi ran drafts in 1977. Korrumburra, Bells Point on the Landys property and Tarwin Lower all ran drafts in the late 70's.

The GCA was affiliated with the SCA until a motion was passed on the 16th of June 1985 to become independent of the SCA.

Things were a lot different in those days, the secretary and president ran a lot of the drafts as they didn't have individual committees, so organisation and tidying up afterwards was done by a few members of the Association committee.

John Coates states he remembers going a day early to Bairnsdale to muster cattle prior to the draft. Others remember mustering cattle at Landys and Warrigul Creek.

Arenas were not quite the same as today. The grounds were never plowed up and Hinnomunjie was run in the middle of the race track so after the cattle had finished their run they just disappeared "over the Hinnomunjie horizon" according to Gerald Ventry and were mustered later on. So there wasn't as much cattle containment as there is nowadays.

In the very beginning there were no front gates, just a couple of blokes with bags to block up. There used to be two judges which changed to one when the SCA rules changed.

The GCA began the helmet wearing rule and the SCA followed.

The kids of the day were put to good use running score tickets from the judges to the secretary's office until they began to use blackboards to write on.

There was time to have a lunch break when a beer or two might have been consumed before starting up again. An advertisement for Hinnomunjie draft in 1974 states that the draft will start at 9am sharp! What a luxury that would be. It also stated that riders compete at their own risk. A little bit different from these days of insurance and liability.

It was agreed among a few of the old crowd that transport in particular has changed a great deal and some felt that the horses have improved immensely, but others felt that there were horses in the past who were just as good if not better than many present day ones.

One thing that everyone agreed on was that we always had a lot of fun and made some fantastic, lifelong friends. There are numerous stories and tall tales to be told, many of them extremely funny.

It is a testament to the sport of campdrafting that original members became friends, their children who grew up together are mates and now their grandchildren have become friends too. Three generations of families are travelling and competing together.



It was a fantastic two days of riding with lots of learning. Our instructors were all fantastic and devoted all their time to each rider. I cannot thank them enough. The feedback from all riders was amazing. Everyone really enjoyed themselves and gained a lot of confidence and knowledge.

Kathryn and I would like to thank Tracy Scoble for taking on the catering organisation. Trace went above and beyond and made sure everyone was fed and so much more. Trace, you were absolutely amazing and I could not have done this without you. Thank you to Colin Stockdale for carting some of his beautiful cattle to get us started in the morning as a last minute request. We finished at lunchtime which was lucky as the rain came in while we were cleaning up.


